Pennsylvania State Parks offer special opportunities for organized groups to tent or camp in a state park.

These areas are usually in a remote area of the park to allow your group the opportunity to interact in a quiet, relaxing setting.

Site Amenities

The organized group tenting area has many useful amenities for larger groups. These amenities include:

Comfort Station:

A comfort station is located a short distance away, at the far corner of the parking lot. This station features one men's toilet and one women's toilet, pit-style.



Tenting Area:

The tenting area features ample space, capable of accommodating 25 individuals. More than 25 is possible; contact the park office for more information.



Water and Firewood: Firewood is located in a covered station adjacent to the tenting area, along with potable water (available mid-April to mid-October).



Parking:

The large parking lot is spacious enough for multi-passenger vehicles, and is conveniently located in a close proximity to the tenting area which allows equipment trailers to be parked next to the warming hut if desired.



Eating and cooking area: There is a large fire ring for cooking, and two picnic tables for dining convenience.





Meeting space / warming hut The warming hut can be used for programs or meetings during inclement weather. It is capable of accommodating 25 individuals and is nonelectric.

The Organized Group Tenting area is available for reservation at the following rates:

State Resident: \$25 per night Non-resident: \$37 per night

Note: Charges for camping may be waived if a conservation volunteer project or service project is performed. Contact the park manager for details.
