



On August 27, 1859, the Drake Well struck oil at 69½ feet, launching an industry that has forever shaped our modern world. Today, nearly every facet of our lives is impacted by oil and natural gas. Petroleum is used to power our vehicles, to create medicines that keep us healthy, to heat our homes and to make the clothing, plastics, cosmetics, computers and other personal products that enhance our daily lives. And, it all began along Oil Creek just outside Titusville, Pennsylvania.

For nearly 80 years, Drake Well Museum and Park has preserved and interpreted the site of Edwin L. Drake's 1859 oil well, chronicling the birth and development of the petroleum industry in Pennsylvania as well as its growth into a global enterprise. The heart of the museum site is our board-for-board replica of Drake's original engine house. Built around the National Historic Landmark well, this exhibit features operating period machinery and demonstrates how Drake drilled for and pumped oil in 1859. The museum grounds also feature a spring-pole drilling rig, an operating central power oil lease, a standard drilling rig, a pipeline pump station and more. Visitors experience life on an oil lease through the sights and sounds of operating machinery as well as through coopering and blacksmith demonstrations.


In 2012, Drake Well celebrated the opening of its new 10,000 square foot petroleum exhibit, "There's a Drop of OIL and GAS in Your Life Every Day!" Visitors feel their senses come alive as they tour this state-of-the-art exhibit. Beginning in the new Charles Suhr Orientation Theater, they are able to see, hear, smell and feel oil, from its discovery to the present day and beyond. The exhibit explores the technological, scientific and social history of the petroleum industry, highlighting 520 artifacts and featuring interactive as well as video and touchscreen displays. Not only do guests learn about the birth of the industry, they discover the story of its growth beyond the nineteenth century and how petroleum has come to impact their lives every day.

After soaking up all of Drake Well Museum's exhibits, visitors bask in the natural beauty of Pennsylvania's Oil Creek Valley. Our 240-acre site boasts myriad recreational opportunities, including bike and hiking trails, trout fishing, picnic pavilions, geocaching and a boat launch for kayaks and canoes.

Located at 202 Museum Lane in Titusville, PA, the museum is open year round. Hours of operation, admission rates and information about programs and special events is available at www.drakewell.org or by calling (814) 827-2797. Drake Well Museum and Park is administered by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission in partnership with Friends of Drake Well, Inc.



The Tyred Wheels Museum has just the antique car for you, along with an assortment of antiques bicycles and toys.



Take a ride through "the Valley that changed the world" on the Oil Creek & Titusville Railroad. The OC&T is a vintage train with a narrated tour through Oil Creek State Park. While on the train, you can even mail a postcard from the only operating Railway Post Office car in the country.

Do you know where the first successful oil well was drilled? While thoughts of Texas or Oklahoma might come to mind, it was actually drilled right here in a quiet little valley in Venango County, Pennsylvania. The discovery of oil shaped the nation and changed the world. We are proud of that fact!


> birth of the petroleum industry and the "valley that changed the world".



It began in August 1859, when oil was struck at 69 1/2 feet! The region and the world were changed forever when Colonel Edwin L. Drake drilled the first commercially successful oil well near Titusville, Wells sprouted throughout the region. "Boomtowns" sprang up overnight (and in some cases disappeared as

quickly!) Derricks dotted the hillsides. The oil boom brought great wealth to the area. The remnants of this past magnificence can still be seen in the graceful Victorian architecture throughout the region.

You can see from the photographs on this page how Mother Nature has regenerated the valley from the oil boom days. In waters that were coated with oil in years gone by, today bass anglers and fly fishing anglers wet their lines in the clean crisp waters of the scenic Allegheny River and Oil Creek. The Great Blue Heron has established rookeries to raise their young and bald eagles fly the skies.



The region's history does not end with oil, nor does it begin there. The Seneca Indians of the six Nations of the Iroquois Confederacy first settled here in the early 1600's. One of the tribe's leaders, Chief Cornplanter, was awarded land by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in what is today downtown Oil City. Later, local prospectors built a blast furnace, mill and foundry, and purchased the land. It became known as Oil Creek Furnace and was in business for more than 40 years.

The confluence of French Creek and the Allegheny River was a key strategic site during the French and Indian War. The French lay claim to the territory sending an advance party, in 1753, to build a fort. In early December, the British sent the young Major George Washington to warn the French of their trespassing on land claimed by Great Britain.

The French defied Washington's warning and constructed Fort Machault, massing a large force of French soldiers, Native Americans, and boats. The plan was to launch an attack on Fort Pitt, in what is now Pittsburgh, reclaiming Fort Duquesne for France. However, before the attack could be launched, the commanders received word that British forces were attacking French outposts along the Great Lakes. The French sped north to protect Fort Niagara, after burning both supplies and Fort Machault. Reclaimed by the British, the new Fort Venango was built, only to be destroyed during Pontiac's uprising in 1763. The New American nation raised Fort Franklin in 1787, the site of the present day City of Franklin.







Trails

recreational trails

The Oil Heritage Region has five asphalt-paved recreational trails covering over 60 miles for biking, hiking, skating or walking. Each is a segment of the regional Erie-to-Pittsburgh Trail connecting the two cities traveling through rural western Pennsylvania.


Enjoy the combination of natural beauty and historical significance as you ride starting on Titusville's Queen City Trail and then the Oil Creek State Park Trail that follows the development of the oil industry in the 1860s and the original railroad grade in the valley. Interpretive signs are along the trail between Titusville and Petroleum Centre.

The Samuel Justus Trail is approximately six miles in length, along the Allegheny River between Oil City and Franklin and meets the Allegheny River Trail at the Saltbox Visitor's Center. Then the ART takes you through two railroad tunnels: the Kennerdell Tunnel, 15 miles south of Franklin is 3,350 feet long; and the Rockland Tunnel, 21 miles south of Franklin is 2,868 feet long. Be sure to bring a light since both tunnels are very dark. About 14 miles south of Franklin, riders/hikers follow a well-marked 1/2 mile detour on a private, dirt drive meeting the pavement again to continue south.

The Sandy Creek Trail has twelve miles of asphalt surface, five pedestrian-safe bridges, and Deep Valley Tunnel. The Belmar Bridge spans the Allegheny River, is 1,385 feet long with a wooden deck and railings and has a great view of the valley.

Two Mile Run County Park has miles of hiking, equestrian and mountain bike trails. Stay close to the activity centers of the beach and nature lodge or enjoy the forest with views of the lake or challenge yourself with a ride on single-track. The Park is a ten to fifteen minute drive from Oil City, Titusville or Franklin. This rolling 2,695-acre park surrounds a 144-acre lake. The lake is brimming with a variety of fish, with easy access to the lake and boat launch. Watercraft rental, swimming, pavilions, campsites, and all-season activities provide an adventure for families all year long. It is also home of the Oil Region Astronomical Observatory.







Oil Creek runs through the valley from Titusville to Oil City. Oil Creek State Park offers excellent fly-fishing along the creek as well as the Delayed Harvest Areas. An incredible flowing-water smallmouth bass fishery exists on French Creek through the summer and fall. These species are the perfect catch from a canoe during a float downstream. The wild and scenic Allegheny River contains an abundance of fish, including northern pike and smallmouth bass. Between October and December, this is a good place for walleye. If you are looking for a tug of war with flathead catfish, fish at night with live bait from July to September. Two Mile Run County Park provides great fishing for both cold water and warm water species. The 144-acre Justus Lake, the man-made centerpiece of the park, is a popular ice fishing spot. For the angler looking to catch their first legal muskie this is the place to try; this same lake is home to some nice bluegills. Only electric motors are permitted.

Kahle Lake in southern Venango County has largemouth bass and quality yellow perch. This 250-acre lake permits electric motors only. Bring your canoe or kayak and enjoy the

peace and quiet of these waterways.

Titusville Walking Tour

Titusville was known as the 'Queen City' for its rich cultural amenities, including the region's first opera house. The Historic District is a compact representation of Titusville's built environment as it developed from the beginning of the oil industry in 1859 through the turn of the century. Its architecturally significant churches, homes and commercial buildings are described on 21 interpretive panels.

Oil City Walking Tours

From the late 1860's to the mid 1950's Oil City was known as the "Hub of Oildom" since it was the center of the oil industry. The corporate offices for both Quaker State Oil and Pennzoil were located here until the late 20th century. The city has three listings in the National Registry of Historic Places - the Oil City South Side Historic District, the Oil City North Side Historic District, and Oil City Downtown Commercial District. There are two walking tour brochures - the Historic South Side Walking Tour and Northside Historic District Downtown Walking Tour, as well as one driving tour, the Northside Residential Historic District Driving Tour.

Franklin Walking Tour

A major portion of Franklin's architecture was erected during the late 19th and early 20th century. All of the period's architectural styles can be seen in some form in downtown Franklin, including Gothic Revival, Victorian, Second Empire, Queen Anne, Tudor Revival, Italianate, Stick and Romanesque. The Franklin Self-guided Walking Tour lists many of the buildings and parks that are located along historic Liberty and Thirteenth Streets in downtown Franklin.

OIL CREEK STATE PARK

The Oil Creek Valley is the site of the world's first commercial oil well. Moreover, Oil Creek State Park tells the story of the early petroleum industry by interpreting oil boomtowns, oil wells and early transportation. Scenic Oil Creek carves a valley of deep

hollows, steep hillsides and wetlands. A train still chugs through the valley and stops at the Petroleum Centre Train Station, just as it did nearly 150 years ago.

TRAIN STATION:

The train station visitor center features displays, programs and a diorama of Petroleum Centre from the late 1860s. The visitor center is open Saturday and Sunday 11 AM to 5 PM Memorial Day to mid-October.

DAY-USE AREA: Picnic tables, grills, horseshoe pits and volleyball courts are available for family outings. Electric and nonelectric pavilions can also be rented throughout the year.

HISTORICAL TABLEAUS: These fullscale, three-dimensional landscapes contain buildings, machinery, equipment and materials that replicate the historic landscape. Similar to a movie set, the buildings are empty and the machinery does not work, but the tableaus give you an idea of historic periods at Oil Creek.

HIKING: 52 miles of trails! Self-quided trails include Delzell Trail (.7-miles), Blood Farm Interpretive Trail (.5-miles), and Petroleum Centre walking tour (45 minutes). Remnants of old refineries can still be seen along the trails.

GERARD HIKING TRAIL: The 36-mile long trail encompasses the entire park.

Two overnight hike-in shelter areas (Cow Run and Wolfkiel Run) are along the trail. Each area contains tent sites, six Adirondack-type shelters with fireplaces, restrooms and water supply. Organized group tent areas are also available. A fee and reservations are mandatory for use of these areas and overnight usage is limited to one night per

> shelter site. Fires are permitted only in camp stoves, fireplaces or designated locations and must be extinguished when unattended. Standing timber and shrubs must not be defaced. Camping is permitted in shelter areas only. Other special regulations pertain to these areas. Contact the park office for further information.

FALL/WINTER: With over 6,300 acres open to hunting, Oil Creek offers plenty of hunting opportunity. Common games species are grouse, rabbit, deer, turkey, squirrel and bear. During the winter you can enjoy over ten miles of X-country skiing. Ski passes are required and can be purchased at the booth near the warming hut or at the park office.

CANOEING/KAYAKING: Oil Creek offers a scenic float and is classed as a beginner's creek under normal conditions. Water levels can change rapidly so it is recommended that canoeists call the park office for current water conditions. Generally, the canoeing and kayaking season is March to June.

FISHING: Oil Creek is known for its smallmouth bass and trout. Boughton Run, Troy Run and Jones Run provide brook trout fishing. Two delayed harvestartificial lure only areas cover 2.5 miles of Oil Creek. Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission laws apply.

KENNERDELL TRACT OF **CLEAR CREEK STATE FOREST**

The Clear Creek State Forest consists of 3,165 acres in Venango County and 1,012 acres in southern Forest County, and is named after the clear stream that flows through the Jefferson County tract.

WILD AND NATURAL AREAS: While Clear Creek State Forest does not have any designated wild or natural areas, it does contain areas that are specialty managed. Dennis Run is an exceptional value watershed with a reproducing native brook trout population. This tract includes a stone iron furnace on Bullion Run constructed in the 1840s and remnants of the past and present oil and gas production sites.

HIKING AND CAMPING: Hiking is available throughout the forest on 35 miles of trails. Primitive camping is permitted along all but the Beartown Rocks and sections of the Little Clear Creek trails.

FISHING AND BOATING: Fishing for cold and warm water species is available during the appropriate season in many creeks that wind through the forest.

HUNTING: Hunting for deer, turkey, grouse, squirrels, rabbit and black bear is a popular use of the forest during designated seasons. Other than a few safety zones hunting is permitted throughout the state forest.

MOUNTAIN BIKING: Mountain bikes may be used on most roads and trails on Clear Creek State Forest unless otherwise posted.

HORSEBACK RIDING: Horseback riding is authorized on all State Forest roads and trails, with the exception of those trails designated off limits to horses at Kennerdell tract in Venango County.


